Simply stated, Hemp is the longest, strongest most durable natural fiber known to human kind and has been used for over 12000 years. Hemp can be grown in 2 months, does not require herbicides or pesticides, and uses a fraction of water compared to cotton. Hemp can produce 4 times as much pulp per hectare than trees and can produce over 50000 products including paper, plastics, cosmetics, clothing, food, fuel, wood products and medicine. Using Hemp helps create environmentally friendly industries and solves the deadlock between ecology and economics. This planet needs Hemp. We need Hemp.

FOOD

Until the past century, Hemp Seed was a staple food for virtually all the peoples of the world. Often used in porridges and soups, hemp seed was an inexpensive food staple. Hemp Seed was also made into butters and oatmeal. Hemp Seed can be pressed for its highly nutritious vegetable oil and grounded hemp seed (or the byproduct of pressing) can be used like a flour, to make breads, cakes, cookies and other dishes. Hemp Seed can be made to be similar to tofu. If hemp seeds are sprouted they can be used as any other sprout for salads, or even diary products such as milk or ice cream.

It is interesting to note that prior to this past century, hemp seed cake was one of the world's principle animal feeds. Hemp seed provided a complete diet for all domesticated animals including dogs, cats, chickens and cows.

Pregnancy is known for great physical discomfort, and cannabis performs well as an anti-inflammatory and analgesic agent, and also to reduce the characteristic stress of pregnancy, by relaxing uterine contractions.

Cannabis Children

The “Prenatal Marijuana Exposure and Neonatal Outcomes in Jamaica: An Ethnographic Study” concluded that the children of prenatal marijuana users had significantly higher test scores of non-associative learning with auditory and tactile stimulation, a higher alertness, a greater ease in receiving comfort, and had fewer startles and tremors than typical babies following the first week of birth. After thirty days, babies had higher quality of alertness, more robust voluntary and involuntary reflex systems, less irritable and better organizational skills than children born of non marijuana using mothers.

Longer term studies have shown there is no consistent evidence of any significant differences in the development of prenatal exposure to cannabis, against those who are not exposed. It can be determined that cannabis exposure is likely more benefit to children, than a hindrance.

In a court case (in the USA), one grow operation was busted with the method above, and while in court they argued that the FLIR system was used against their rights under the Fourth Amendment.

Fourth Amendment: 'The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no Warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized.'

The district court concluded that the defendants had no subjective or actual expectation of privacy in the area scanned by the police with the FLIR. The court said that FLIR is limited to "detecting differences in temperature on the surface of the object being observed," and "did no more than gauge and reflect the amount of heat that emanated" from the defendants' house. In other words, the FLIR registered only heat escaping from the defendants' house. The court described this escaping heat as waste heat, or "abandoned heat," because the defendants had not tried to prevent its escape. Indeed, they used fans to vent the heat to the outside, voluntarily exposing it to the public. They never attempted "to impede its escape or exercise dominion over it." Under these circumstances, the court concluded that the defendants did not have an actual or subjective expectation of privacy in the waste heat.


